I just want to tell you briefly about the two books that I read on holiday as they were so good:

The first was The Forgotten Village by Lorna Cook, which was so interesting as it is a fictional and partly true story about Tyneham Village The village that was commandeered by the War Office during the 2nd World War and was never handed back to the villagers). Tyneham is a very enigmatic place and I am sure that a lot of us have probably visited this village in the Purbecks. The book is set in 2 different time periods i.e. 1943 and 2018 and is a very good mystery story.

The second book is called The Foundling by Stacey Halls and was a Sunday Times bestseller. This is one of my favourite types of stories, i.e. a good story based on historical fact. Set in London in 1754 the story tells of one way in which unmarried mothers could have their babies cared for in Foundling Hospitals and how they could reclaim them if their situations improved. Many twists and turns in this story that kept me glued to the book.

The current balance is slightly in excess of £14,000 and this sum will remain "ring fenced" for the music

section for the moment. Should a new music section be formed in the future then this sum would be available to the group but it will eventually revert to the HCA if no progress is made towards this end.

The closure of the section does not mean the end of music at Greystones. Live music can be enjoyed every Friday morning at Friday Live and the singing for fun group, Rockin' Robins meets twice every month on a Monday afternoon. There is also live music at many of HCA's social events.
